Sacred Heart Catholic School Patriarch Leaves Behind a

Legacy of Love and Gervice



In John 13:15, Jesus sets an example for us to follow. He encourages us to follow his lead and serve one another.

"I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you." Jesus says.

If you have spent any time during the last 68 years on the Sacred Heart Catholic School campus, odds are you have seen SHCS alumnus Sylvan Walterscheid quietly at work, setting the example Jesus asks us all to do in serving one another.

Sylvan attended grade school in the historic red brick building. His Freshman through Junior years of high school, classes were held in the old "Tin University". With pride and excitement, SHCS seniors began their last year of high school in the newly constructed high school building, which still serves our students today. Sylvan's love of and service to Sacred Heart Catholic School, began even before his graduation in 1955. Whether singing in the St Cecilia's choir, serving as an officer of the 4-H Club, serving as class officer, receiving All State honors as Center and Co-Captain of the football team or, playing basketball and baseball for the Sacred Heart Tigers, Sylvan displayed loyalty and love for his school. Sylvan found another kind of love while attending SHCS. He and fellow classmate, Theresa Mae Felderhoff, began dating their Senior year, which led to their marriage in May, 1958, resulting in four children who also graduated from

a living and raising a family. Sylvan's strong work ethic extended far beyond seeking monetary reward for his efforts. His true passion was in quietly serving others. Sylvan could be found seeking out and doing whatever needed to be done. No task was too menial. Whether picking up trash around the football field after home games, chopping weeds on the school grounds with his homemade chopping hoe, refurbishing a statue of the Sacred Heart, painting the school lockers, spraying weeds on the parish grounds or repairing the sprinkler system, Sylvan was there with a smile and a willingness few possess. He also volunteered his time and talent coaching the Sacred Heart Cub football team, ran the chains at games when needed in addition to providing maintenance to the football field. Sylvan and Theresa Mae worked tirelessly with the Sacred Heart Alumni Association, serving as officers, working the concession stand and wherever else help was needed. Sylvan served multiple terms on the Sacred Heart Catholic School Board. He was also a board member of the Sacred Heart Trust Fund and the Sacred Heart Cemetery board.

Sylvan had the privilege of watching his children and then his grandchildren excel in sports at Sacred Heart School. He thoroughly enjoyed watching his sons on the football field and his daughters on the basketball court. In later years, Sylvan could be found at football, baseball and basketball games cheering on all his grandchildren, five of whom are either presently attending or have graduated from SHCS. Sylvan not only supported his children and grandchildren in their endeavors but encouraged and supported all the students both academically and in sports.

Sylvan's life of service extended beyond the Sacred Heart School family. He was one of the first participants in local ACTS retreats, and then in typical Sylvan style, went on to serve as a leader at countless retreats. Sylvan was a man deeply rooted in his Catholic faith, having participated in a Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Group since 2006.





As the Sacred Heart School family joins with Sylvan's family in mourning his passing from this earth and remembering his many acts of kindness and service throughout his life, in gratitude we reflect on the words of Matthew 25, "Well done my good and faithful servant."

TECHNOLOGY UPDATE





In the year 2000, Sacred Heart Catholic School offered high school students a class called Advanced Technology. The class was taught by Mrs. Patti Bayer. The class was composed of four students who were utilized as technology aides. The students received hands-on learning setting up computers, installing software, and completing minor repairs. Little did Mrs. Bayer know that she was training one of her students, Nicholas Taylor '01, to one day take her place.

After graduating from Sacred Heart Catholic School in 2001 and completing a college degree, Taylor spent a decade teaching in public schools before returning to Sacred Heart as a teacher in 2016. Initially hired to teach junior high and high school social studies classes, Taylor added technology classes to his course load in 2017 after successfully passing the state exam for certification in EC-12 Technology Applications.

In 2020, principal Nisa Lagle asked Taylor to take over as the school's technology director. During his first days as technology director, Taylor took the time to familiarize himself with the school's existing technology. He found that much of the school's technology, software, and network infrastructure were outdated and no longer supported. Teachers and students were using computers over a decade old. Servers were nearly a decade old with one running Windows Server 2008. The school's network infrastructure was in desperate need of moderniza-

The school's technology needs were great, but funds were unavailable to complete the necessary work. Taylor initiated conversations with school

administration, school finance committee members, and Alumni & Supporters members to identify sources of funding for the school's technology. Individuals and organizations stepped up to provide funds that allowed the school to purchase Chromebooks for student use and obtain surplus computers for teacher use, but needs remained high.

In late 2022, alumnus Tim Sicking '77 made a generous contribution of \$100,000 to the Alumni and Supporters. The Alumni granted \$30,000 to the school for the purposes of upgrading technology. Using the donated funds, Taylor quickly set to work making upgrades to the school's technology. By December 2022, a new and modern server was ordered for the school and installed over the Christmas holiday.

To bring the school's network infrastructure up to date, Taylor began working with Nortex Communications to plan and install new network switches, wireless access points, and as necessary new network cabling. Work on this project was completed in June 2023. With the completion of this project, the school has faster internet throughout its campus buildings.

Despite the significant upgrades and improvements that have been made to the school's technology, there is much work to be done. Technology is always changing. Technical requirements change. Companies end support for operating systems and software. New hardware is introduced while some becomes obsolete. Financial support is needed to help ensure that Sacred Heart Catholic School can keep its technology up to date. Financial constraints make it difficult to pay



for these upgrades out of the school's operating budget. For example, Microsoft will end support for Windows 10 in 2025. Current teacher computers can not support Windows 11 so it is necessary to obtain new computers. Costs to replace teacher computers are approximately \$25,000, a large sum of money.



A Campaign of the Advancement Foundation

Dear Alumni and Supporters,

Sacred Heart Parish and School have been the spiritual center of Muenster since the very beginning. The Parish capital campaign, "Our Time, Our Community, Our Future" seeks to reinforce the worship and the mission of the Parish and School, and therefore strengthen the bonds of our community.

The campaign was kicked off last September, and we are making great progress. This three-year campaign seeks to raise \$3 million as our celebration goal and \$4 million as a stretch goal. As of this writing, we have raised \$836,775 in paid donations and \$455,598 in pledges. The current donors represent 27.5% of our Parish membership.

On the construction end, the first of seven projects—new bleachers at Tiger Field—has been completed! Many of you will be attending a game this season, and I hope you enjoy the much larger seating area, experience the enhanced sound quality and admire the wider, brand new press box.

Our next project, a new HVAC system for the grade school, is currently in the bidding process. The new system will replace the old boiler, radiators, and A/C window-units in each classroom. We have chosen to install ductless mini split units in order to be minimally invasive on our beautiful, 99-year-old school.

Many folks have expressed to me that they intend to give, but just haven't gotten around to it. If that's you, then now's the time! Our next project is the most expensive one, and we'll need your help in order to get started on construction.



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
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
